Published today at InvinciBull and the CDT, the list of ways to know if a VPN is reputable lays out how InvinciBull keeps user data safe from hacking and tracking, and never shares user data. The CDT took on VPNs as an issue because the industry is rife with personal VPN companies that sell user information rather than protect it, as InvinciBull does. InvinciBull is backed by a strong privacy policy, and deploys patented, AES 256, military grade encryption.

Late last year, the CDT launched an initiative aimed at helping consumers better understand VPNs and assess their trustworthiness. The privacy advocacy group developed a series of questions and recommendations for VPN providers that, when addressed completely, serve as a guideline to assess whether the VPN can be trusted with a user's personal browsing information and web traffic. The framework was developed in consultation with leading VPN providers, which proactively answered the CDT's questions to provide greater transparency about their data protection practices. InvinciBull addressed all of the CDT questions and recommendations in its "Signals of Trust."

In signing the declaration, InvinciBull has joined a highly select group of leading VPN companies who have chosen to make their privacy practices transparent including Express VPN, TunnelBear, IVPN, and Mullvad. InvinciBull, with its always-on feature, is designed for ease of use for people who use public Wi-Fi -- business travelers, people who work remotely and others who need security on the go in airports, cafes and hotels.
